ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Drawing from the rich wellspring of the contemplative tradition and the charism of mercy, this two-year certificate program nurtures and supports those who wish to deepen their own spirituality and discern spiritual companionship with others. The curriculum includes a particular (but not exclusive) focus on the art of spiritual accompaniment with those on the margins of society.

While many program graduates go on to serve as spiritual directors, others apply the skills they acquire in the fields of church ministry, education, healthcare, social work and more.

REQUIREMENTS OF PARTICIPANTS

- Applicants must have been in some form of spiritual accompaniment for one year prior to program start
- Continued commitment to personal spiritual direction
- Continued participation in a faith community
- Required reading
- Written reflections on readings monthly and yearly integration papers
- Meetings (virtually or in person) with a designated group of peers
- Continued involvement with those on the margins
- Practicum: During second year, participants become actively involved in the ministry of spiritual direction and receive formal monthly supervision

PROGRAM TIMEFRAME AND STRUCTURE

- June retreat weekend at Cranaleith (Friday and Saturday)


Second Year (2022-2023)

PROGRAM TUITION

Cost of two-year certificate program:
\$4,500

Cost includes:

- Onsite retreat days
- Tuition for monthly virtual sessions
- Ten individual supervision sessions during the second year practicum
